**COURT REPORTER SERVICES** 

Administrative order no. 2024-0322

During the past 5 years, the number of court reporters employed by the Santa Barbara Superior Court has declined due to retirements as well as departures to the private sector. Despite persistent recruiting efforts, the court has been unable to hire court reporters to replace those that have left. Historically, the court reporting unit comprised of 15.5 reporters and 1 supervising court reporter, but now has only 12.5 reporters available on most days. The average daily need for courtrooms is 14 reporters. The crisis has now reached the point that the court is struggling to provide court reporters for mandated courtrooms. Due to the immediacy and severity of the crisis,

## THE COURT THEREFORE FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Effective March 25, 2024, the court will no longer provide a court reporter for the following proceedings:

<u>Civil</u> – Evidentiary Hearings, Court Trials, and Jury Trials

<u>Family Law</u> – Evidentiary Hearings and Court Trials, except for Family Support matters heard by the Family Law Commissioner

Probate - Evidentiary Hearings and Court Trials
