3 GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF
4 AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR
OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

5 Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and Governor
6 Newsom's Executive Order N-38-20 and the March 30, 2020 statewide order and the December
7 15, 2020 Order ("Order") of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council
8 of California, issued in response to the December 11, 2020 request for an emergency order made
9 by the Superior Court of Santa Barbara County ("Court"), this Court HEREBY FINDS AND
10 ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

11 1. Any Judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of
12 the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary hearing examination and the defendant's right to
13 release from 10 court days to not more than 30 court days;

14 2. Any Judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 1382 of
15 the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than an additional 30 days,
16 applicable only to cases in which the original or previously extended statutory deadline
17 otherwise would expire from December 17, 2020, through January 15, 2021, inclusive (Gov.
18 Code, §68116(1)(10): Executive Order N-38-20 (03-27-20)

19 3. The Court will collaborate with local justice partners to conduct a trial at an
20 earlier date, if a court may do so in compliance with applicable health and safety laws,
21 regulations, and orders, including the use of remote technology.

22 4. Hold sessions anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile
23 detention facilities, from December 17, 2020 to January 15, 2021.

24 THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
